Welcome to the latest edition of the Sanderstead update.

We would like to give you an update about crime and policing information in the Sanderstead area, which also includes parts of Selsdon and Hamsey Green.

Local police officers together with the ward panel members for Sanderstead have set three 'ward promises'. These promises are what your local policing team will focus their efforts on in order to reduce crime in the area.



PRIORITIES

Burglary

In October, 0 Residential and 3 Business & Community Burglaries took place.

The good news is Sanderstead hasn't had any residential burglaries this month. The bad news is businesses/shops have been targeted. The burglaries have all taken place overnight.

We have seen two shops targeted in Elmfield Way with cash, a till machine and card readers taken. We are asking businesses to review their security. External shutters, although effective, may require planning approval. Use attack-resistant laminated glass in sturdy frames where possible. Alternatively, film can be applied to glass to make it more resilient. Doors and windows are particularly vulnerable – use security-rated products to make them more burglar-resistant

Motor Vehicle Crime

In October, 7 Theft from Motor Vehicles and 1 Theft of Motor Vehicles took place.

This month we have seen vehicles being targeted for either power tools or Catalytic converters.

Hybrid vehicles are most commonly targeted, as their metals are more valuable, but any vehicle can be at risk of catalytic converter theft. Do not attempt to approach these criminals, call 999 at the earliest opportunity.

Signs a catalytic converter theft is being committed

- a vehicle being raised using a car jack in a car park or residential area
- a loud drilling or cutting sound coming from underneath the vehicle. Don't assume it is builders.

Transit vans have been targeted more than any other vehicle over the last few months. If you have a transit van or know anyone with one. Please remove your tools and secure your vehicle when left unattended.

We are seeing a trend whereby suspects are bold enough to break into vehicles during the day and take tools whilst tradesmen are working on a property. LOCK YOUR VEHICLES even if you are working nearby. Always manually check if the vehicle is locked.

Drug Stop

The team continues to work hard to reduce all forms of Anti-Social Behaviour on the ward. The team regularly patrols areas that have had ASB/drug related issues in the past. During our routine ASB patrols, the team stopped and searched two males in South Croydon. As a result of the searches the team found a small quantity of cannabis in one of the males possession. A community resolution (warning) was issued to the male as it was his first drug offence.

Fireworks

Be safe with fireworks. you cannot buy 'adult' fireworks if you're under 18, and it's against the law for anyone to set off fireworks between 11pm and 7am, except on certain occasions. Used irresponsibly, fireworks can cause damage to property and do significant harm to people and animals. Not only is there a danger from fireworks exploding, they can also pose a serious fire risk as well. This is why members of the public may only use fireworks on private property, such as their back gardens, and only licensed professionals can use them in public places.

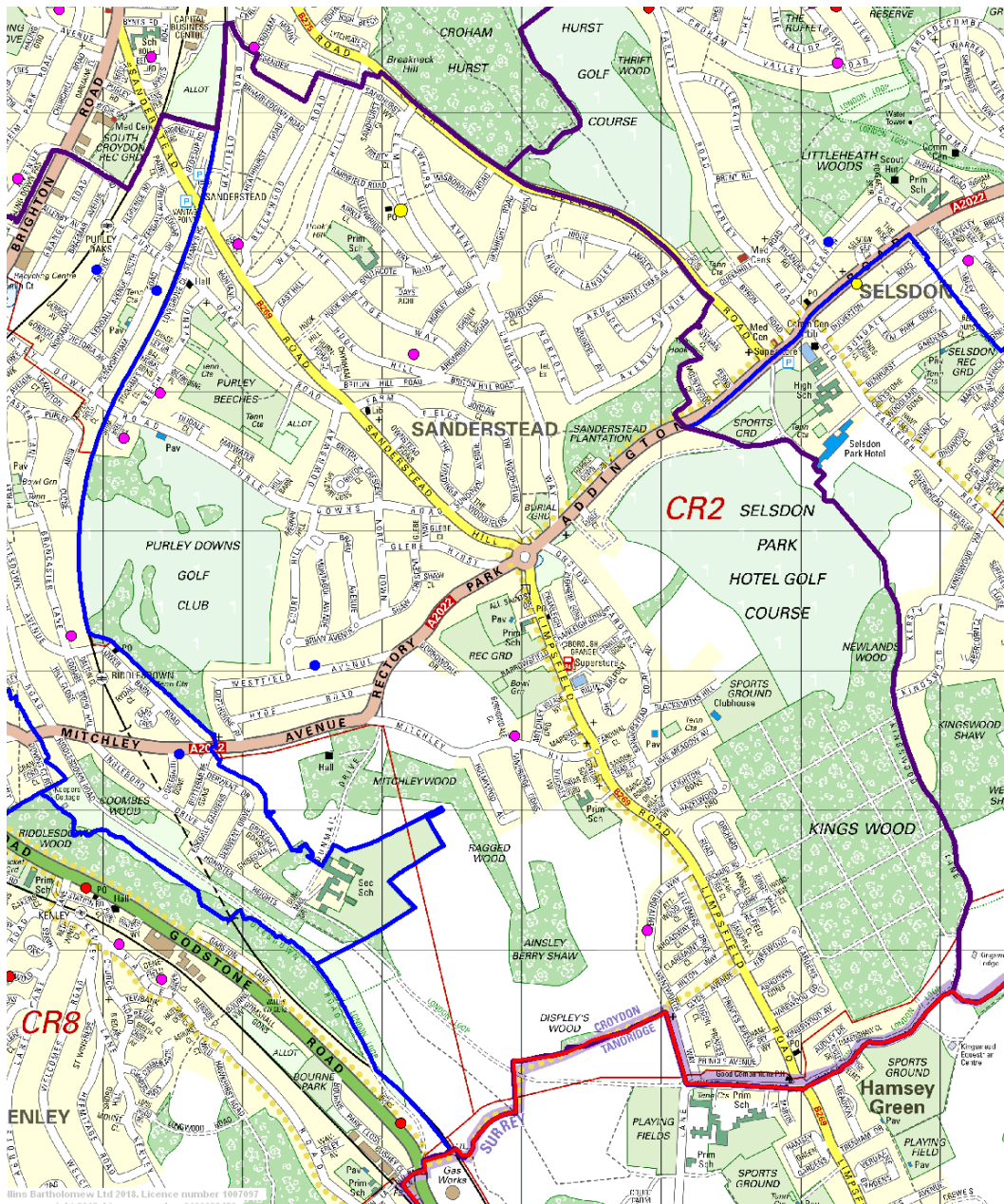
